The foam insulation on the underside of the Fire Hall roof has made a big difference and I have been authorised to purchase and get installed some reversible fans to push the rising warm air down.

I am pleased to announce, that Australian turner Jack de Vos will be conducting a Full Day demonstration at the Fire Hall on Saturday April 26th. Times to be announced. The fee for this full day demonstration will be \$40.00 per person. While coffee and Timbits will be provided please bring a bagged lunch or if you choose, dine at one of our many nearby restaurant's .

Over the past few months, The Mayor has repeatedly asked me when we anticipate having a Grand Opening of the Fire Hall Facility, complete with a ribbon cutting ceremony. Considering that the municipality has made a \$20,000.00 investment in this project, I think that this request by the Mayor is only fair, which leads me to the following proposal.

Over the holidays, I was contacted by American turner Lyle Jamieson, (Check out his website: www.lylejamieson.com) Lyle is internationally known for his beautiful female torsos which are multi axis turnings which are then hand sculpted. Lyle contacted me to inquire about my health and also about my progress with the Fire Hall Project. I brought him up to date and he immediately contacted me offering to run a workshop in our new facility, if I thought there was sufficient interest. It immediately occurred to me that it would be a great idea to invite Lyle Jamieson to attend the Official Opening and at the same time we could have a week long public exhibition of his work in

the Gallery next door. In addition I would like to see a full display of members work laid out in the Fire Hall for viewing by the public. Lyle has offered to conduct demonstrations over the Saturday and Sunday interspersed with some teaching sessions. Starting out on Monday he would conduct a 2x day foundation class for beginners followed by a 3x day hollow turning course for the more advanced turners. In each case there will be a registration fee set for prospective students. Lyle will also be available to do some private tuition in turner's own workshops. The following Saturday & Sunday could also be teaching sessions or a club demo as per the demand.

When I suggested this proposed format to Lyle he got really excited and said "Let's do it". I believe that as a member of the Art's Centre Committee, I will be able to convince the Mayor and my fellow committee members to support this event and hopefully put together a brochure. I want to involve our local newspapers as well as our local TV station in promoting this. I have already sounded out the GHWG and the TVWG and both Presidents are excited and supportive. One member of the GHWG has already informed me that he will be bringing his Jet Mini Lathe with him and anyone who would like to do likewise is welcome. I hope to have some costs available in time for our meeting on the 15th January.

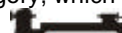

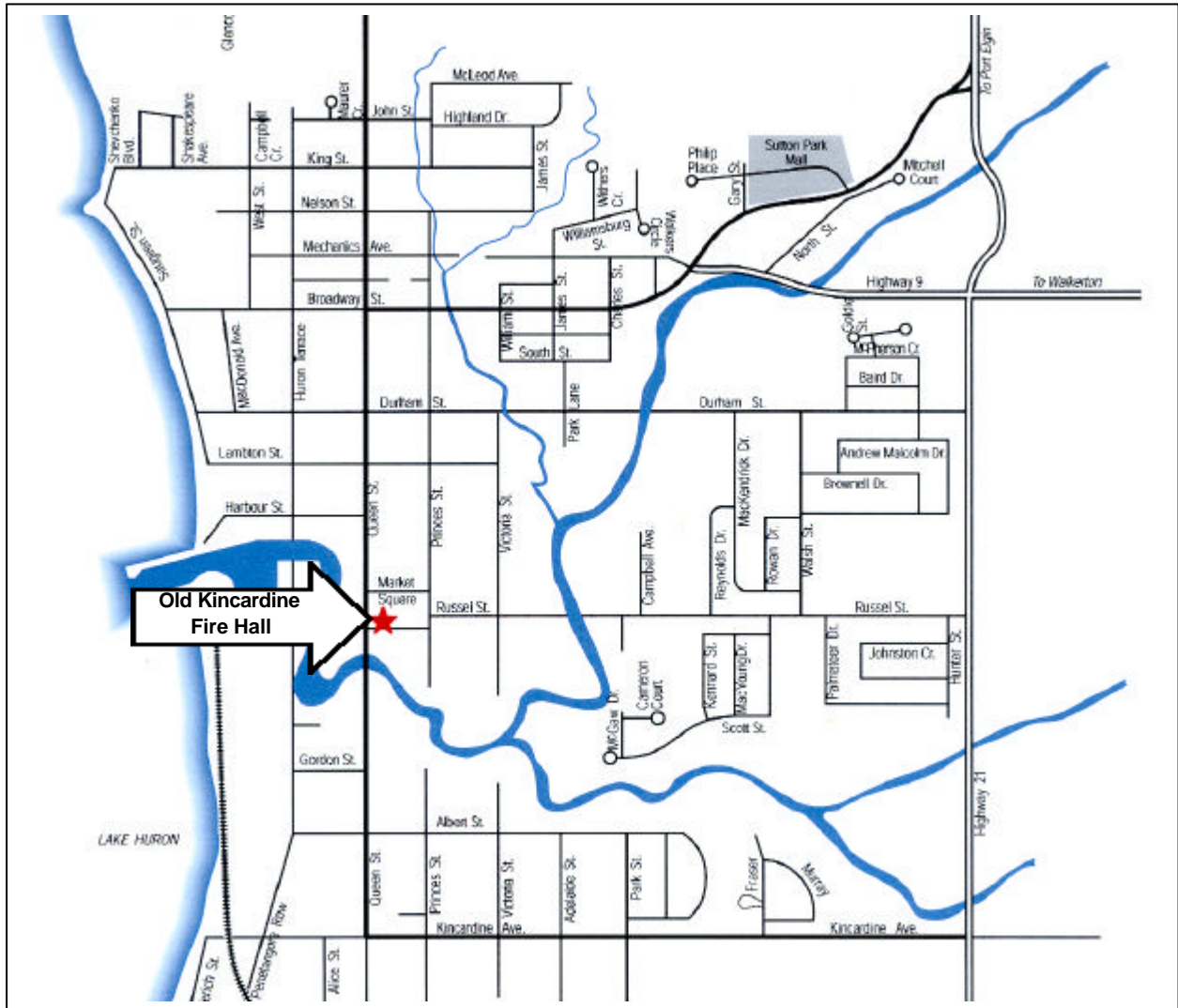
