Presidents Message

I am pleased to report that we had a really good attendance for the Hollow Turning demo on Saturday April 26th by Australian turner, Jack de Vos from Perth WA. A total of 27 turners registered for this event, this was surely the best-attended event our club has ever hosted. A sincere "Thank You" for the support provided by the members of the Thames Valley Woodturner's Club in London, who drove up to join us for this our very first event in our new facility. I received many positive comments and e-mails from TVWG members regarding our new facility and for the excellent workshop provided by

our talented guest from Australia. It was a really successful day for our club and from what I observed, everyone enjoyed the opportunity to make new friends and talk turning. On the trip back to his daughters in Orangeville that evening, Jack de Vos expressed his appreciation for the warm hospitality and the positive feedback he received from you all.

The fire hall facility is a work in progress and as such there are a number of improvements we can undertake to make it an even better facility. Before the official opening on the 7th June we are going to give the interior a facelift with a fresh coat of paint. On Saturday the 3rd May several members commenced this work, by carrying out a clean up of the interior of the walls and floor. This was followed by the painting over of the existing blue paint on the walls with tinted oil based primer. We will finish coat the walls with a semi gloss latex tinted the same colour as the overhead doors. Once the walls are completed, we will then commence painting the floor with silver grey floor paint. One of the problems highlighted at last Saturday's demo, was that at some point in time, we will need to construct a sound proof booth, in which to install an air compressor. The noise from this piece of equipment is a major distraction and drowns out the voice of the demonstrator. I am compiling a list of small projects we can undertake to improve our facility and these will be presented to you at our next regular meeting.

If there are any members who need a supply of wood for turning, please feel free to search through the wood piled behind the rear partition and take whatever you need. Some of this wood is badly checked and therefore is unsuitable for turning, but it would burn well in a wood stove! So please help yourselves and reduce the size of the pile at the next meeting. We have lots of wood stored down at the Geddes Mill in log form, so we are not short of a supply

of turning wood. Once the work in the fire hall is complete, perhaps we can organize a work bee, to cut up the wood at the Geddes property into turning blanks.

We need to acquire a slide projector for the club and as these seem to be going out of style, I thought I might make an appeal for one through you the membership. If you have one, which is surplus to your requirements, would you consider selling it to the club or maybe even donating it to the club? At the Jack de Vos Demo last Saturday, I was lucky enough to be able to borrow one from the Photo Shop on the main street.

Oneway Manufacturing in Stratford, will be loaning us a lathe for the Lyle Jamieson workshops in June. It will either be the "New" 1640 model announced in February or the larger 2436 model. I have been contacted by a number of turners from other clubs in Ontario who have registered for one or both of the Lyle Jamieson workshops. I hope that when Bert returns from his vacation in Europe, his mailbox will be overflowing with completed registration forms!

Members please note that your \$35.00 annual membership renewals are due as of 1st of January, please see Bert our Treasurer at the next meeting. Your memberships are our main source of revenue and allow us to bring in guest turners to demonstrate for us. Hope to see you all at our next meeting on Wednesday 21st May at 7.30pm.

Harbour arts & crafts Show Call for artists

The City of Owen Sound is proud to support the first-ever Harbour Arts & Crafts Show, an opportunity for local artists and craftspeople to display their products for show and sale on the beautiful Inner Harbour of Owen Sound.

The Harbour Arts & Crafts Show is scheduled to run on two different holidays this summer, Canada Day Tuesday July 1 from 12 to 6 pm and Sunday August 3 from 2 to 8 pm. A total of 25 booths will be allocated along the west harbour walkway, near the Marine & Rail Museum. The show is open to any craft artists producing and selling their own handmade items. Registration and booth allocation is on a first-come, first-served basis. A registration fee of \$10 is required for each of the two shows, which will be returned if no more booths are available.

2. Complete the application form and return with payment. Applications without payment will not be accepted. Booths will be allocated on a first-come, first-served basis. One booth will be allocated for each artist, to a maximum total of 25 booths.
3. The artist must provide tables, chairs, and any other items required for the booth.
4. Letters of confirmation with a site plan indicating booth location and other details will be sent to applicants by June 15, 2003.
